The Charis Prison Ministry in Minnesota owes its existence to the Cursillo movement and to the Holy Spirit moving in the hearts of hundreds of Cursillistas. For over 35 years, Charis (formerly Kairos) has reached into five Minnesota prisons and ministered to thousands of men and women in the name of Jesus Christ. For many of us. our call to prison ministry came following our respective Cursillo weekends and the challenge put forth in the model of the 3-legged stool. And as you may have observed, once we participated in Charis, we were hooked.

Today, Charis of Minnesota has a mailing list of more than 700 current and former volunteers, many of whom continue to volunteer on the inside, or support our weekends through prayer and financial gifts. And our weekends inside prisons (7 Charis weekends are conducted annually in MN at present) continue to fill up quickly. With some weekends limited to 36 weekenders, the waiting list can be as high as 100 people hoping to get in. Men and women alike are hungry for the truth of the Gospel. For many who are unchurched, Charis is a short course in Christianity that must substitute for a basic Sunday School education.

Considering that our volunteers AND our weekenders come from a wide variety of Christian churches representing all denominations in our communities and in our prisons Charis had no choice but to eliminate denominational flavor and aim for a truly ecumenical process. Since the early 1990s when we broke away from the national Kairos and became Charis Minnesota, our spiritual directors have worked hard to tailor their words and their practices according to the words and practices of Jesus in Scripture. Our Act of Remembrance, for example, is taken directly from the words in the Gospels, so that all present may be invited and included in the communion meal, in the unity of the Body.

Over the past two years the Charis Board of Directors has spent much time and energy in prayer, seeking to discern the future direction for our ministry. We recognize that our volunteer base is aging quickly and we have made volunteer recruitment a high priority. For that reason, we have determined that Charis must work to develop new volunteers through all possible paths, including the invitation to our Charis graduates (the Overcomers) to join us on an outside weekend that will begin to develop future team members and leaders. Those who know us will help us carry on the Charis ministry.

Charis is looking for ways that we can join with the Twin Cities Cursillo communities in reaching outside our congregations to engage with those who would not typically have the opportunity to experience the Cursillo retreat and the community waiting to welcome them. We believe the Cursillo method remains a viable tool for sharing God's love in our communities. We have no wish to compete with or replace any of the denominational Cursillo movements. However, we recognize that our path must continue to be nondenominational and must minister to the unique needs of our community members.

The Charis ministry remains committed to our incarcerated brothers and sisters. Our dual purpose is to expand our boundaries and follow the Holy Spirit wherever that leads us. Please consider how you might join us in this step outside our comfort zones, into the unknown, hand in hand with the Holy Spirit, in an effort to revive and strengthen this life-changing ministry.

Charis is poised to hold its first outside-prison weekend from June 22 to 25, 2017 at St. James Lutheran Church in Crystal. Make plans to join us for the closing on Sunday, June 25

## **Bringing Out the Best in Each Other**

God has blessed us with another beautiful Shakopee weekend. I wonder if any other February weekends got to be enjoyed with open windows and temperatures in the 50's and 60's? And it was not just beautiful naturally, but also beautiful in the supernatural power of our Lord. As I remember back to last fall when I was asked to pray about becoming the lay director for this February weekend, I think I actually groaned out loud with dread. I wondered if perhaps we could wait 14 years until I retired! Even though I accepted without much joy, the Lord brought blessings abundantly. **He is gracious beyond measure.** 

As I began inviting volunteers to the team I began to worry that I wouldn't be able to fill the team. We have many snowbirds who are unable to serve in February. A dear friend shared her story of returning from vacation to her busy life and upcoming surgery. As she sat in the airport, she imagined herself putting all those cares into a big basket and handing them over to Jesus. I decided that I could do the same with the things I was tempted to worry over in preparing for this weekend. I pulled out a basket and a pile of colorful index cards. Every time I began to fret over something, I wrote it on a card and put it the basket for Jesus. Now as I look at those cards I am reminded of all the people who accepted the invitation to serve and all the ways He answered and provided for each need. He is faithful beyond measure.

The weekend passed by so quickly: 13 talks, Stations of the Cross, poster parties, the Agape dinner, the most beautiful outdoor burning of forgiveness lists ever, and then suddenly we were at the Closing Ceremony. I am amazed that the 36 weekenders before us were the same 36 weekenders from Friday evening. They seemed so different. Yes, they were different. The transforming power of Jesus' love had been at work in them and in us for the past three days. They had been experiencing God's reconciling and unconditional love, some for the first time. They testified over and over again of arriving to the weekend broken, sad, hopeless and feeling alone. What did they find and what were they taking away from the weekend? Hope, joy, new community, knowing that they are loved, peace. One weekender joyfully noted that it was a shame to have to come to prison to have a man pull out a chair for her for the first time! It was so beautiful to see tears of joy and hear all their laughter. He is loving beyond measure.


